### At the Greenway Centre

- 3. Filton Airfield:** Mike reported that an invitation had been received to meetings to be held at the Airfield on Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> April and Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> April to outline revised plans.
- 4. Pocket Park:** BCC will not undertake insurance liability and STD are examining the issues involved.
- 5. Southmead Road Police Station:** The site has to be vacated by 10<sup>th</sup> April, the Police beat team will be relocated to Bridewell temporarily, with police having at times to resort to bus travel to reach Southmead, Henbury and Brentry.
- 6. Arnside regeneration:** Helen Bone said that she is being employed one day per week by STD to move the project forward. She stressed that this is a long term plan and will only go forward if the community supports it. A Community representative working group will be set up which will report back.
- 7. Henbury and Brentry Newsletter:** Dave reported on discussion he had with interested parties with regard to making a donation in line with that to The Mead recently. He confirmed that the full wellbeing grant had been received.
- 8. Any other business:** A meeting is arranged with The Police and Crime Commissioner, Sue Mountstevens for Monday 20<sup>th</sup> March at the Greenway Centre from 7pm.

The garages at Bradwell Grove are now to stay and no decision has been made about those in Twenty Acres.

Mike reported that he had been contacted by Matthew Lipton who is the newly appointed “Commons Stewardship Officer” for South Glouc Council. Mike suggested that he attend a future meeting.

Sites for up to six notice Boards had been suggested around Southmead by a sub committee and subject to NP approval finance was available.

The Southmead Festival will be held on Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> July and the Goram Fair on 9<sup>th</sup> September.
