1. **Attending:** Dave Fogg, Brian Newland, Alex Kittow, Christine Portch, Rose Carr, Sue Potter, Chris Eggleton, Ian Smith, Alan Piper, and Keith Houghton.
2. **Apologies:** Mike Murch, Pat Harrison, Brenda Massey, Mark Weston.
3. **Pen Park Hole:** Graham Mullen has been in touch saying the entrance to the Hole Is on land owned by BCC and that the West Passages are under land Likely to be developed for the Co-op and possibly owned by the Developer.
4. **Wayfarer:** Mike has been in touch with Matt Taylor of Savill`s, the agents, Matt is unaware of any changes to the original plans. He did report that the BCC Enforcement Officer had been in touch regarding Fly Tipping.
5. **Pocket Park:** Design illustrations were shown and appreciated, there was a suggestion that sculpted figures be included, but it was suggested that this was the final agreed design.
6. **Dunmail:** Awaiting planning approval – United Communities are taking part in a Schools workshop and have asked BS10 to attend, Mike and Alan have To attend.
7. **Financial:** Dave reported that the Wellbeing grant had been received and he had paid for the January and February meetings at Greenway.
8. **Henbury Centre:** Rose reported that the Council had agreed to a Community Asset of the building and they hoped to be up and running in the new year.
9. **Any other business:**
  - a. It was reported that the Police were renting Southmead House from the Council and were moving in on 1<sup>st</sup> April 2017.
  - b. **Richeson Drive/Monsdale Close:** Plans had been drawn up by BCC and the local people consulted, after consideration option 2 had been selected.
  - c. **Glencoyne Square:** Positive feedback from both residents and the City Council means that funding for a pre planning application for up to 200 units is the next step. The STD will

be also looking for funding for up to 8 people to take this to the next level.

- d. The Ranch:** Support funding has now been withdrawn and the possibility of a Community Asset transfer is being considered.
- e.** Concern was expressed at the uncertainty surrounding St. Mary`s Henbury vicarage.  
Construction traffic for the proposed Charlton Common developed was also of concern.
