

**MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD AT
THE GREENWAY CENTRE
MONDAY 13TH JANUARY 2020**

2. **Apologies** were received from: Sam Masson, Tony Whitelaw, Helen Godwin, Brenda Massey, Paul and Wayne Lennon, Julia Gilvear, Anthea Mustard and Chris Windows.
3. **Minutes of the November 2019 meeting:** were signed by Alan Piper.
4. **Dunmail Update:** Sally Gilbert from United Communities and Jeremy Johnson from the builders Engie, reported that they are hoping the first phase will start to be occupied during April/May this year, with subsequent phasing to follow throughout this year with completion of the site early 2021. They did point that building work had been adversely affected by the recent and continuous heavy rain. Jeremy said that he had been in touch with the Council regarding repairs to Lanercost Road. There will be a show home open to coincide with the first phase which people are encouraged to have a look round. The Art project surrounding the electric substation has been completed and will be stored until the site has been completed in an effort to protect it from mud splatters.
5. **Charlton Rd/West Way/Arena update:** Charlotte Hanna and Russell Nunn from YTL both attended, Charlotte gave a very comprehensive video presentation of their plans and aspirations for the new arena to be sited in the existing central Brabazon Hangar, together with a Festival Hall and Community Hub located in the two “smaller” side hangars. Russell the explained their plans for the Charlton Rd/West Way application, emphasising that there will be **NO ACCESS TO THE NEW ARENA FROM CHARLTON ROAD. VEHICLES NEEDING TO ACCESS THE ARENA SITE WILL BE ABLE TO USE WEST WAY ONLY AFTER CROSSING THE “AIRFIELD” FROM THE NORTH.**
There will be two separate bus gate cameras installed, one before the junction with Charlton Road this will allow Airbus and other regular users through to Airbus and another on the airfield side of the junction with a similar purpose, as long as drivers enter and leave in the same direction

no sanction will be triggered, but if they activate both North and South cameras then a fine will follow. The operation of these cameras will be the responsibility of South Glouc Council.

Russell the explained how sound proofing was measured and used in and around the Arena to minimise the impact on local residents.

We will now be hoping to arrange a visit to the hangars in the near future.

- 6. North Bristol Relief Sewer:** Alex Aulds from Wessex Water was able to show a short film illustrating very clearly how the new sewer system will be installed, with a minimum of disruption. He also explained how the impact of the recent heavy rain had affected the project. He was also able to answer several questions from residents.

- 7. Arnside and Glencoyne Regen news:** Hannah explained that some minor changes were made and it was hoped that the planning application would go before the Planning Committee hopefully in March, when local resident support would be helpful. Public consultations were planned on the future use of the open space, a “Friends of Glencoyne Square Group, Local Lettings policy and the use of possible Community use space (laundrette?). The City Council are hoping to start their public realm changes in September.

- 8. Team Southmead News:** Deana reported that Inclusion Southmead have arranged a Computer Course at Greenway aimed at non users. Work had restarted on the alterations to access gates for Doncaster Road Park. She had also written to the First Bus Group about disabled people being not allowed on some buses, and as a result the CEO of First Bus would be at their April meeting. Port Elizabeth House now have a brand new laundry. Team Southmead have applied for funding to set up a Friends of Southmead Library Group, and should know the result in February.

- 9. Henbury and Brentry Community News:** Mark reported that Aldi will be closed for a month from April, he explained that cardboard **must** now be put into the new blue bags. Litter picks continue, further vandalism has occurred at Blaise despite CCTV. He warned about the possible future dangers to green spaces of the demise of the Joint Spatial Plan. The Iron Bridge had been damaged again, and there was still an ongoing impasse between Heritage England and The City Council about funding for remedial work. Blaise parking charges were imminent, the state of footpaths within Blaise Castle had again been reported. installation of the MUGA had been delayed by a shortage of Council staff. the Henbury spur railway was on course to open in 2021.
